We will be having soccer sign-ups early in an effort to get our seasons off and running before weather becomes a major factor! The first sign-up will be held in the Warren School Cafeteria at 6:00 p.m on Thursday ,Sept. 2<sup>nd</sup>. An additional sign up will be held on Saturday,Sept.4<sup>th</sup> from 10:00 a.m to 12:00 p.m at the Warren Travel soccer field behind the Fire station, with clinics for all age groups. Clinics will run from 10:00 to 11:00 for K-2 and 11:00 to 12:00 for the travel Grades ( 3<sup>rd</sup>/4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup>/6<sup>th</sup> ).
